### **UPDATED: COVID-19 patient screening and testing**

# Testing update for aerosol generating procedures (AGPs) administered in <u>outpatient</u> areas

- Nebulizer treatments and PFTs: COVID-19 testing within 72 hours of procedure is required for all patients. Screen all patients upon arrival and utilize appropriate precautions for positive or symptomatic patients if treatment is indicated.
- + <u>Stress testing</u>: NO pre-procedural COVID-19 testing required. Screen all patients upon arrival and utilize appropriate precautions for positive or symptomatic patients if treatment is indicated.

### Pre-Surgery/Pre-Procedure Testing Plan Update

Patient Status	72 Hours	Day of Surgery
Admitted post-op	PCR*	No test required
Immunocompromised	Home antigen test*	No test required
Outpatient procedure/surgery	Home antigen test*	No test required
Pt symptomatic on arrival day of procedure	N/A	Antigen test required – collected in ASU and sent to SHG lab
Local anesthesia	No test required	No test required

\*If positive test, procedure rescheduled according to guidelines unless urgent/emergent. Whenever possible, another patient should be scheduled into the open OR slot. If cancellation same day, must be escalated to lead anesthesiologist for confirmation.

Please note: There is no distinction between a vaccinated and unvaccinated patient in above testing plan.

### Guidance for ambulatory care waiting rooms

Below is guidance for ambulatory care site waiting rooms, given recent questions about resuming "business as usual":

- + Waiting room chairs can be added back to your waiting rooms to accommodate patients, but not fully to pre-COVID-19 capacity.
  - Arrange waiting room chairs no closer than <u>3 feet</u> from one another versus the previous 6 feet recommendation.
- + <u>Universal masking</u> remains a mandatory requirement for all providers, staff and patients (as long as patients can tolerate wearing a mask).
- + Ensure that <u>hand sanitizer</u> is readily available in waiting rooms.
- + Consistent and frequent <u>cleaning of all surfaces</u> in waiting rooms and patient care areas should continue.
  - Surfaces include tables, chair handles, and any other high-touch surface areas in the waiting rooms and patient care areas.
- + Paper brochures, magazines, etc. should remain absent from waiting rooms.
- + Individuals should not drink directly from water fountains (bubblers).

During the heightened periods of COVID-19, we learned to expedite throughput within the ambulatory practices and care sites. Given the relaxation of some of the standards, optimal throughput should remain a priority and staff should continue to minimize patient waiting.

#### STATUS REPORT: COVID-19 cases

As of this morning, we had 5 patients who tested positive for COVID-19 hospitalized across our system – with 1 positive case in ICU. In addition, we had 3 PUI hospitalized across our system – with NO PUI in ICU.
