# Reminder to assess and vaccinate patients to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19

- Vaccination and compliance with all safety and Infection Prevention policies reduces the risks of spreading COVID-19.
  - + Southcoast Guidance for PPE Use and Optimization (Updated 06/24/22)
- All staff and patients should be "up to date," with COVID-19 vaccination.

- You are "up to date" with your COVID-19 vaccines when you have received all doses in the primary series and all boosters recommended for you, when eligible. See also <u>Criteria for "up to date"</u> in this bulletin.
  - + A second booster is recommended for all adults ≥ 50 years old and those with immunocompromising conditions.
- Quarantine, testing and follow-up is required for anybody who is NOT,
   "up to date" with vaccination.

### **Contact tracing**

- Post-exposure contact tracing of patients and staff is still required when a positive COVID-19 case is identified.
- As per the "Return to Work" decision algorithms, leaders are expected to notify Infection Prevention when potential exposures may have occurred:
  - + Employee notifies Manager if test result is positive.
  - Manager notifies Infection Prevention if employee had patient contact within 2 days of symptom onset. Email: <a href="mailto:lnfectionPrevention@southcoast.org">lnfectionPrevention@southcoast.org</a>.

Return-to-work (RTW): When to notify Employee Health if you test positive and what information to provide

Employees who test positive for COVID-19 must be cleared to return to work.

The <u>return-to-work online form</u> should be completed (or an email sent to <u>SC-CovidReturn@southcoast.org</u> with the information on the list below) <u>on day 5</u> <u>after a positive test (not any sooner)</u>.

Criteria for "up to date"

Individuals are considered up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines during the surveillance period of June 27, 2022, through September 2, 2022 for the purpose of NHSN surveillance if they meet (1) of the following criteria\*:

If Under 50 Years:	If 50 Years and Older:
Received at least <b>one booster dose</b>	Received second booster dose (or received first booster dose less than 4 months ago and not yet eligible for a second booster dose)

<sup>\*</sup>Individuals with a moderately to severely immunocompromising condition are considered up to date in the following cases:

- 1) Received an additional dose less than three months ago, if primary series was the Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine; or
- 2) Received an additional dose less than two months ago, if primary series was the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine; or
- 3) Received an additional dose and one booster dose less than four months ago, or

4) Received a second booster dose.

#### STATUS REPORT: COVID-19 cases

As of midday, we had 25 patients who tested positive for COVID-19 hospitalized across our system – with no positive cases in ICU. In addition, we had 15 PUI hospitalized across our system – with 2 PUI in ICU.
