Know where to Go for Your Medical Care



If you are in a life-threatening or emergency medical situation, go to your nearest Emergency Room as soon as possible or call 911.



Your primary care physician (PCP) should be your home base for illnesses or chronic condition management. Your PCP can address:

- Cough, cold, flu
- Ear infections and sore throat
- Minor injuries like sprains, bumps and bruises
- Skin problems
- Urinary tract infections
- To receive immunizations
- To get your prescriptions refilled
- Referral to specialists
- Chronic health conditions & routine check-up



For medical care that is quick and reliable when your PCP is unavailable, turn to Southcoast Urgent Care to treat:

- Fever without a rash
- Allergies
- Skin conditions or burns
- Animal bites
- Non-life threatening allergic reactions
- Ear pain
- Painful urination
- Persistent diarrhea
- Sore throat, cold, flu
- Vomiting
- Minor trauma, sprains, shallow cuts, contusions, or broken bones

Go to an emergency department or call 911 for conditions such as:

- Shortness of breath
- Chest pain
- Change in level of consciousness or mental state/dizziness
- Thoughts of hurting yourself or others
- Difficulty speaking, seeing, or loss of vision
- Numbness/weakness in face or arms/legs
- Blood in urine, stool, vomit, or coughing blood
- Poisoning or overdose
- Serious wounds or injuries (uncontrollable bleeding)
- Severe pain (head, neck, or abdominal)
- Severe allergic reactions
- Active labor (call your OBG/YN office prior to arrival at the ER)
- Anything your provider indicates may be an emergency



- ° New or worsening shortness of
- ° Change in level of consciousness or mental state
- ° Thoughts of hurting yourself or others
- ° Difficult speaking or seeing
- ° Numbness/weakness in face or arms/legs
- ° Blood in urine, stool, vomit, or coughing blood
- ° Poisoning or overdose
- ° Serious wounds or injuries, uncontrolled bleeding
- ° Any problem you think may be an immediate threat to your life or health
- ° Anything your provider indicates may be an emergency
