# Public Health Emergency Updates as of May 11, 2023

On May 11, 2023, the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency will end.

On the next day, **effective May 12, 2023**, Southcoast Health will implement the below changes regarding masking at all Southcoast locations.

The guidelines below are subject to change according to the prevalence of COVID-19 or other diseases within our region or organization, and/or recommendations provided by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

# Masking Guidelines for Patients and Providers Effective May 12, 2023

# For Patients and Visitors:

• For patients and visitors **NOT experiencing** COVID-19 or other respiratory symptoms, masks are optional.

- For patients and visitors **experiencing** COVID-19 and other respiratory symptoms, masks are required. When possible, we recommend limiting interaction with others if you are not feeling well.
- For patients and visitors with an immunocompromised state, masks are strongly advised.

#### For Providers and Staff:

- For providers and staff who are vaccinated against COVID-19, masks are optional.
- Unvaccinated providers and staff must continue to wear a face mask to protect themselves and others from the risk of COVID-19 and should understand and assume the risks of non-vaccination, which includes serious illness.
- For providers and staff caring for patients without signs/symptoms of COVID-19, masks are optional.
- For clinical conditions requiring <u>droplet</u>, <u>airborne</u>, <u>or contact isolation</u>, all providers and staff should continue to wear appropriate PPE.

We emphasize that all individuals may choose to continue to wear a mask based on their individual comfort level. These guidelines are subject to change and may be updated according to the prevalence of COVID-19 or other diseases within our region or organization.

#### Please note that in Cancer Center areas, masking will be required in certain situations.
